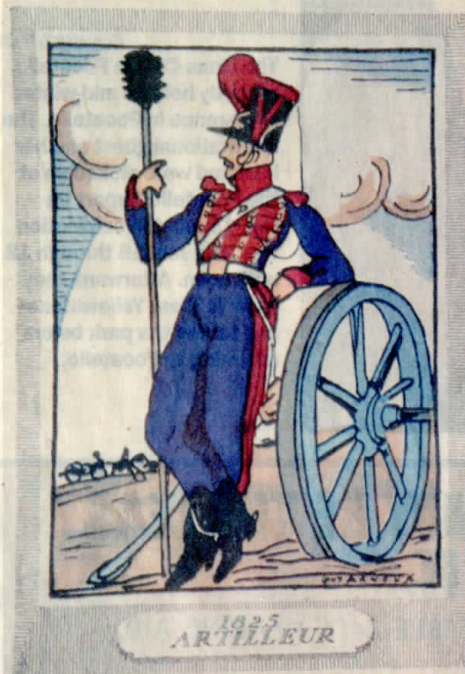

## ISU sets exhibit of World War I French prints

POCATELLO — Justin Dolan Stover, an Idaho State University assistant history professor, will host an exhibition of contemporary French prints of the World War I, which he collected during his trip to France.

The exhibition, "Les Misères de la Guerre: French perspectives of the First World War" will run Feb. 2-20 with an exhibit launch and discussion Feb. 12 from 5 to 6 p.m. at the John B. Davis Gallery in the Fine Arts Building at ISU.

The exhibition presents varied perspectives of the war through the medium of select contemporary French

weekly magazines. It shows how the centenary of the First World War invites attendees to reflect on the conflict and its enduring cultural, economic and political impact.

Remembrance of the event is varied and often walks the line between honoring the fallen and lamenting their loss, Stover said. The same can be said of the civilians and prisoners who endured the war, and the widows and orphans who matured in its wake.

This event is organized by the Department of History, Department of Art, Phi Alpha Theta and the Committee for the Study of War, Violence and Conflict in Society at ISU. This is a free event open to the public.
